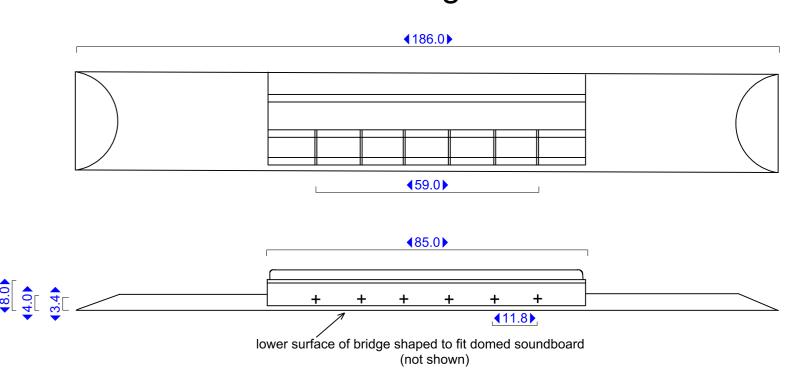

Many guitars by this maker were examined, and their outline shapes vary considerably, either due to deliberate experimentation or unintentional distortion over time.

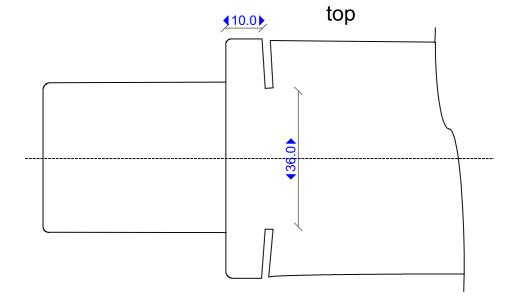

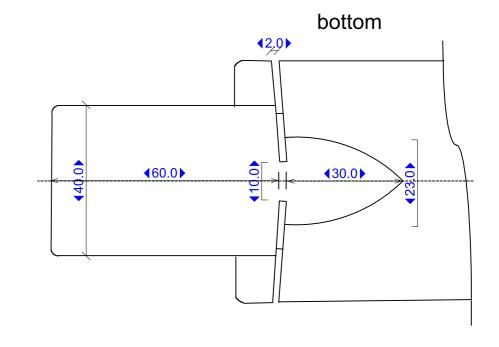
Constructing an historically-based stringed instrument is to a large extent an interpretation of the old instrument by the new maker. Plans are a useful guide, but final subtleties of outline shape, thickness and dimensions will be influenced by aesthetic judgements, and sensitivity to the acoustic properties of the materials available to the contemporary maker.
